The Vicar's letter

A few years ago I was called up for jury service. When the judge made his closing remarks he said that we could only find the person guilty if the evidence that had been presented convinced us beyond reasonable doubt

Many Christians down the ages and across the globe have believed in the actual and physical resurrection of Jesus from the dead because the evidence has convinced them beyond reasonable doubt. For example, the former Chief Justice of England, Lord Darling, said, 'In its favour as living truth there exists such overwhelming evidence, positive and negative, factual and circumstantial, that no intelligent jury in the world could fail to bring in a verdict that the resurrection story is true.'

Richard Swinburn, Emeritus Professor of Philosophy at the University of Oxford, in 2003 wrote a book called the 'Resurrection of God Incarnate.' This book was printed by Oxford University Press and was peer reviewed by his professional colleagues. Swinburn was not afraid to conclude that it is highly probable that Jesus rose from dead. The resurrection of Jesus stands up to rational scrutiny. Yet more importantly it speaks to our deepest longings. An old vicar I knew always used to say at funerals: 'Now, because of the resurrection death is merely a gardener. You don't bury a Christian, only plant them.'

On behalf of all the churches of the Modbury Mission Community I wish you a Happy Easter. Come and join us over the Easter season to find out how the events of Easter turn the grave from a wall into a door.

Easter 2019

Easter Sunday this year is on the 21st April and on that day we hold a communion service at All Hallows. The Benefice celebrations for this key time in the Christian calendar begin with *The Easter Cafe Church* on Maundy Thursday (see ad in this issue) to be held in Bigbury Memorial hall. Later that day All Hallows is to hold a Maundy Thursday communion service at 6.30pm at which all are welcome.

There are Good Friday processions in Modbury and Aveton Gifford and Easter day services throughout the Benefice churches.

John Borne

Local resident John Borne passed away on 7th March and his funeral was held in All Hallows on Friday 22ⁿd March. John lived and worked in the area for much of his life and the presence in the church of over 125 mourners is testament to how much he was loved by family and friends alike. John has been laid to rest in the churchyard and lies above his late father 'Boysie'.

Maintenance Issues

Following the Church Wall collapse in February we have now received quotes from building firms and I am currently seeking permission to go ahead with repairs from the church authorities and SHDC. As the Church building is grade II* listed and the churchyard sits in a conservation area, we have to deal with the repair very 'sensitively' (s I have been advised). Clearly it will be some time yet before you see any work being done to repair the wall.

Last month we had a serious failure of the Church heating system which has rendered it unusable. Whilst there are fewer administrative hoops to be jumped through to replace the system we will have to be sure we find a solution that is wholly reliable and heats the church effectively; something the current system has sadly failed to do.

The FOODBANK is here to help people in crisis in and around Kingsbridge. A container is placed in the Church Porch for items to be placed in which will be taken to the Foodbank every Thursday morning. They are currently welcoming donation of many types of non-perishable items (except Baked Beans and Tea), toiletries such as Toothpaste, brushes and toilet rolls and all types of household cleaning materials. There is a more detailed list of items on the collection box in the Church porch. Please note, however, that the foodbank is unable to accept home-produced goods.



Jingles in March



41/19 **NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN (NP)**

The Steering Group has met twice since the last Parish Council Meeting and is making good progress in writing draft discussion documents for the cardinal items to be included in the final plan. These documents will need to be refined and agreed before being set out in a final format. All policies emerging from this process will be supported by the responses to the Parish Questionnaire and referenced to national and local planning policies.

Bigbury have completed their Neighbourhood Plan up to publication stage. They use a proposal from the National Planning Policy Framework, namely "Heritage Assets", to identify any structure or place which although not Grade II listed in the normal way, still is part of the environment of the village which might be spoilt by indiscriminate development. Such listing does not affect the householders' rights to alter their property but may affect any nearby development by a third party.

Viz:- 192. In determining applications, local planning authorities should take account of:

- a) the desirability of sustaining and enhancing the significance of heritage assets and putting them to viable uses consistent with their conservation:
- b) the positive contribution that conservation of heritage assets can make to sustainable communities including their economic vitality;

There are several Heritage Assets in the parish which are already scheduled as 'Monuments'. The steering group will add to this schedule any building or structure of significance where its history or contribution to the local environment justifies inclusion. Each property owner will be individually consulted concerning its inclusion.

Members of the Steering Group are engaged on a detailed look at CLT and self build options for new development, especially where this may assist younger families to get on the housing ladder in Ringmore. However there

are quite severe constraints that will need to be overcome if this is to be successful. The steering group is to organise a meeting in the WI Hall probably in May to discuss this with interested residents and also to give an opportunity to those people who responded to the parish questionnaire suggesting new activities for the population.






