Night landing site update

I am pleased to advise that at the time of producing this the electric cabling has been rolled out from the Voltage regulator and the trench back filled.

Western Power have attended and made a live connection to the meter box and EDF energy have now made the connection for the energy supply making us live ready to go.

Slight delay in that the production of the steel lighting pole has been delayed but by the time you read this hopefully they will have arrived and will have been set in position and connected. We should be done!

The grant money promised by Devon Air Ambulance Trust totalling £4,938.56p has been received by the Parish Council.

Hopefully we can shortly look at our next targeted project - the replacement, upgrade and support of the defibrillators.

Cliff walking advice.

The cliffs tops on the Devon coast are mainly on the South West Coast Path.

The organisations responsible for managing the Coast Path have developed these guidelines to help you have a safe walk. Please read and always follow them.

Let someone know where you are going and what time you are likely to be back - mobile phone reception is patchy on the coast

Informal paths leading to beaches can be dangerous and are best avoided

If you are crossing a beach, make sure you know the tide times so you won't be cut off. Go to: BBC Tide Tables

Keep to the path and stay away from cliff edges - please follow advisory signs and waymarks.

Whilst it is tempting to go close to cliff edges to peer over you should stay back from them:

as a slip or trip could be fatal

some cliffs overhang or are unstable and this is not always obvious

Take special care of children and dogs and look after them at all times.

Keep your dog under close control – chasing a seagull over the edge of a cliff could have disastrous consequences

Children may not see potential dangers – such as cliff edges - especially if they are excited

Dress sensibly for the terrain and weather. To enjoy your walk, stay within your fitness level – some sections of the Coast Path can be strenuous and/or remote.

Find out about the section you plan to walk

Turn back if the walk is too strenuous for anyone in your group

Remember that in remote areas or at quiet times you may not see another person for some time if you are in difficulties

Take a phone with you

In an emergency dial 999 or 112 and ask for the coastguard.

To help the emergency services locate you quickly they need to know where you are, so:

Learn to read a map to be able to accurately report your position – visit Ordnance survey .co.uk or download the OS Locate app for smartphones.

Look out for the small signs with the location and grid reference that are on many fingerposts and signs along the path.

I am re-running this note about the bottle bank and can advise that the Parish Council discussed this at the meeting in July. I know understand that if bottles are left on top or next to the bottle bank then technically a flytipping offence has been committed.

Many parishioners are familiar with the bottle bank located in the car park of the Journey's End. We should all be grateful to Tracy Heneghan for giving the council permission to site this container on their land as it is a perfect location for us all to recycle glass.

Interestingly the Ringmore container fills up at a higher rate than other equivalent containers in the area. I wonder why? However, once full, some people have been leaving bags of glass bottles either on top or beside the container in the probable expectation that these will be collected by the driver when he comes to replace the full container with an empty one. Regrettably this does not happen and there is no obligation on behalf of the council to collect the excess. Recently some bags of glass which were on top of the container fell on to the ground and there was a lot of broken glass which a local resident was good enough to remove.

If the container is full, firstly try the portholes at the rear; if full also, take the glass home and await the arrival of a new container. There is a telephone number that can be called (01803 861234) if the container is full and this might then speed up the replacement.

100/18 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

101/18 MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

IT WAS RESOLVED THAT the minutes of the meeting held on 12 June 2018 be accepted as a correct record

Resolution **carried unanimously**. The minutes were signed by the Chairman.

102/18 MATTERS ARISING

- **Shed on NT land:** JD to cost three alternatives the chosen shed would then need to JD be submitted to the NT for final approval.
- **Bowling Green Registration:** AK provided details of those who might have knowledge of the gift of the land to the PC. The Clerk would make contact with the objective of obtaining written evidence to enable the land to be registered in the name of the PC.
- **New Resident Welcome Pack:** RB had passed comments from councillors to the Ringmore Residents' Association.

103/18 NIGHT LANDING SITE

It was noted that planning permission had been granted and thus work had been let for:

- Connection to an electricity supply
- Electricity supply
- Electrical installation
- Fencing the landing area against livestock
- Water supply for displaced livestock

Devon Air Ambulance Trust had offered a grant of £4,938.56 towards the total cost of the project and the clerk was authorised to sign the grant offer acceptance on behalf of the PC. It was clear that Steve Comley's fund-raising activity had been so successful that there would be an excess of receipts over expenditure – see below.

VAT of £480 had been claimed from HMRC but not yet paid.

106/18 NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN (NP)

RB reported that a grant of £4,425 had been paid to fund operations until 31 March 2019. Any unspent monies will need to be returned after that date. This funding has enabled the Group to commission DCT of Exeter to digitise the responses to the questionnaire and to write an independent report on its findings. These documents along with other evidence will determine the principles of the Neighbourhood Plan. Any policy included in the final plan must show a clear link to independent evidence collected I the formulation of the plan. The winner of the questionnaire raffle had not yet clamed the £50 prize. The number will be re-advertised together with the reserve number. If there is no claimant by 31 August the prize will not be awarded.

107/18 DISTRICT COUNCILLOR (by e-mail)

The Communities Together Fund (formerly Town and Parish/TAP Fund) is managed in South Hams by South Hams District Council. It is allocated according to the number of electors on the electoral roll, with the District Council contributing ten pence per elector to the fund, and Devon County Council contributing one pound per elector.

108/18 COUNTY COUNCILLOR

The issue of reported near misses with speeding traffic through the village would be reported to DCC Highways for advice.

109/18 PARISH PATHS PARTNERSHIP

The timetable for the Smugglers Path work will be prepared for a post summer scheduling.

110/18 ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS

JD reported that work was ongoing. The clerk would establish if the current grass strimmer (John Reid) wished to continue work in Ringmore.

Clerk's note: John Reid would not be upset if the work was awarded to another person, although he intended to continue strimming the churchyard.

111/18 FETE OR GARDEN PARTY

JW reported that it had been decided not to hold an event in 2018 but there would be a fete or garden party on the August bank holiday in 2019. There need to be a discussion about purchasing new equipment to refresh the event.

It was decided to take no further action on the reported fault with the marquee purchased in 2017.

112/18 APPLE PROCESSING KIT

Apple processing kit for crushing and juicing apples (and other fruit) is now held by the Parish Council. There is a manually operated kit for small batch production, which can be used in any location. For larger batch production, there is an electric mill for apple crushing and a hydro-press for juicing. Clearly these need to be used where there is both electricity and a water supply.

Please contact John Reynolds if you would like to borrow the equipment.

113/18 JOURNEY'S END BOTTLE BANK




