Matthew Syed, a British journalist, author and broadcaster, wrote this a few years ago in a newspaper column:



Atheists should explore CS Lewis. This kind of exposure will not necessarily change our opinions but it will render them more nuanced and infinitely more humane. If we only ever associate with the things we agree with, we are like a scientist wearing blinkers.'

We have already seen quite a few storms this winter which have caused some issues with trees falling across paths and rubbish (with the occasional bit of palm oil) being washed onto the beaches. Thank you to all the people who help keep our beaches litter free, doing a bit of litter picking every time you walk the area really helps and is very much appreciated. If you are walking and see any trees down across National Trust footpaths please do let us know and we will get out there as soon as we can and clear the access.

The pay and scan machines at Wembury, South Milton Sands and Bolberry car park are working well. The National Trust is a charity and our team rely on Memberships and car parking charges to fund our work. For every member card scanned our area will receive £1 from central National Trust which is vital funds for our conservation and improvement works across the stunning South Devon coast. So please if you visit our sites remember to scan your membership card.

If you fancy getting out and active now the festive season is over why not take a look at our Night Run on Saturday 26th January at East Soar Farm in partnership with Cotswold Outdoors. Experience the farm in a new light and let your senses run wild. There are two distances to choose to suit different abilities: The Explorer 2km route which is open to all ages, under 16 yrs must be accompanied by an adult. Run starts at 4.30pm. The Adventurer 9km route which is open to 12+ yrs again under 16 yrs must be accompanied by an adult. Run starts at 5.30pm. 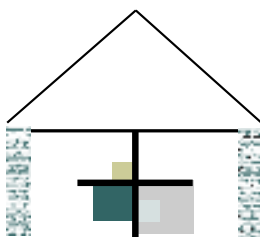
