



June meeting report

At our June meeting we welcomed Dr Pete Moore who has been a "Police Surgeon" In Devon and Cornwall for thirty years, and is the Independent ClInIcal Consultant to Devon and Cornwall police. Dr Moore pointed out that, despite their name, Police Surgeons are completely independent of the police, and do not carry out surgery! Police Surgeons were introduced in the early nineteenth century, though Dr Moore pointed out that the first recorded examination revealed that only one of Julius Caesar's 23 stab wounds was lethal.

There are many different aspects to the job, dealing with both men and women. A lot of their time is spent in assessing mentally ill people, injured prisoners and substance abusers. Frequently, their work has a potentially forensic element, so they have to be properly trained. Increasingly, police surgeons are called in to assist in cases of rape or domestic violence. Examining claims of serious sexual assaults by both adults and children is also an essential part of their role.

There was a good attendance, and James Stevenson gave an excellend vote of thanks on behalf of both visitors and W.I. members.



As the weather warms up and we all spend more time outside I thought I would note down a few reminders about how to keep ourselves, our pets and the livestock safe.

Adders are Britain's only venomous snake. Varying in size from around 40 to 70 cm long, they can be distinguished from other, non-poisonous snakes, like the grass snake and slow worm, by the zigzag pattern on their back. They hibernate during the winter and reappear in spring as their environment warms up. They are commonly found basking in the sun on our coastpaths, heathland areas and in the sand dunes.

Adders are not aggressive, but will attack if caught unawares, or feeling threatened so if you see one give it space, and put your dog on a lead. If bitten it is appropriate to seek medical attention immediately their bites are not deadly, but will be very painful to both dogs and humans, It is advised where possible that dogs are carried to reduce the risk of venom entering the lymphatic or circulatory system. With medical treatment both Dogs and Humans should make a full recovery.

Please can we ask all dog owners to always, always put your dog on a lead around livestock, family pets like mine and yours are responsible for killing and maiming stock. We need your support to prevent animals suffering and loss to our hardworking farmers. It is important to remember that by law farmers are entitled to destroy any dog that injures or worries their animal.

However, if you feel threatened by cows it is recommended that you let dogs off the lead, Move in a careful and calm manner with your body facing the animals, don't turn your back to the animal and run. Please tell the landowner of any attacks or frightening incidents.

Ringmore Parish - Heritage Assets

The planning group are beginning to prepare a list of Heritage Assets that lie within the parish and which may be considered to be an important part of the heritage of this area.

Heritage assets are not listed buildings subject to restricted planning controls, but are:

"A building, monument, site, place object etc. identified as being significant and thereby meriting consideration in planning decisions because of their heritage interest" (Extract from the National Planning Policy framework Feb 2019)

Listing a building as a heritage asset does not affect the owner's current rights regarding their land or in respect of their property to alter, extend or demolish it. The designation is purely there to influence any planning decision in the immediate surrounding area of a heritage asset.

As an example, the owners of the barn conversions at Higher manor Farm might well consider them worthy for designation as heritage assets.

We are inviting readers of the newsletter to suggest assets that might be included on our list of Local Heritage Assets. This list would then be included in the Neighbourhood plan.
