



Services in May and June

Staring last month and continuing into June, our vicar Matt has introduced some new themes into our worship that have temporarily moved us away from the traditional lectionary cycle of on - of recommended readings and related hymns. During May we began with a look at prayer (why and how we pray and who benefits) including a set of sermons and hymns based around a prayer that even non-church goers will be familiar with - namely the Lord's prayer. This will continue during June

when we will move into a detailed look at the book of Jonah. This initiative is proving to be most ^C interesting and informative and shows how Matt is having such a positive influence on our ^{praye} understanding of Gods purpose and our role in this.

Church repair and maintenance







Neighbourhood Plan :- report to the Parish Council AGM 21st May 2019

Almost exactly two years ago the Ringmore Parish Council confirmed its wish to undertake a Neighbourhood Development Plan as outlined in the National Planning Policy Framework. Our Neighbourhood Development Plan forms the third tier of this government policy with the Plymouth and SW Devon Joint Local Plan being the second tier.

The Neighbourhood Development Plan gives local people a chance to have their say on how their parish should develop in the future.

To this end the Steering Group have held several consultations at parish social events and this has been backed up by a detailed questionnaire and Housing Needs Survey. There will be further focussed consultations with the local community before the report is finalised.

Currently the Steering Group are analysing the results of this consultation and drafting policies that are suggested by the majority result of that process.

There is lively debate amongst the Steering Group over several issues which we hope can be resolved by reasoned argument and consensus.

There is still a long way to go before the report becomes accepted by SHDC, a Government Inspector and a parish referendum but when it does it will have the same force as District and National policies and it must be given serious consideration during any planning application for development in Ringmore Parish.

ANNEX A: POLICE REPORT

Ringmore (Kingsbridge West) continues to be policed by PC Ryan Hayhurst under the supervision of Inspector Tapley and Sergeant Dave Green. PCSO Warren Palmer has now retired. In the last 12 months 18 crimes have been recorded in the parish, out of a total of 822 for the whole of Kingsbridge and Salcombe areas. This is against 13 for the same period in the previous year 2017/2018 in Ringmore.

Of the 18 crimes recorded in the last 12 months between 20/05/18 - 21/05/19, the breakdown is as follows:

Assaults 6 Criminal Damage 1 Theft offences 7 Possession of drugs 2 Harassment 1 Offence relating to the Communications Act 1 These figures do not include recorded non-crime domestic incidents, traffic offences and safeguarding enquiries including identifying vulnerable persons within the community and signposting them to the relevant agencies.






