Thanksgiving Service for Phill Errett

All Hallows was bursting at the seams and overflowing with emotion on Friday 27th April as family and friends gathered to celebrate the life and service of Phill, a pillar of the village and a close friend to so many of us. 150 people attended, from near and far, with standing room only, using every spare inch of the church.

The service was caringly taken by our Team vicar, Matt Rowland, and tributes were given by Phill's older brother, John, and Mike Wynne-Powell. Recollections included Phill's early family life, his lifetime allegiance to Woking Town Football Club (now facing possible relegation), which is why everyone was asked to wear something red. After an engineering apprenticeship, Phill's career involved designing and testing tanks, but he was also a live-wire in organising work-based socials.

We were told of his earlier and then later meeting with Sally and how they came to end up in Ringmore after Phill chose early retirement. It seems hard to believe that he ever had doubts about living in the country, because he always seemed so at home here. He helped us all and taught us all so much, founding the Table Tennis Club, running the Church Fete, running, with Sally, a village transport scheme, teaching us snooker and pancake tossing, leading some of us to play golf, whilst all the time taking on whatever needed doing in the church or to the church building, never seeking recognition or even thanks. The whole village has so much to thank him for. His perseverance, peaceful diplomacy and modesty were an example to us all.

But we were only his friends. The loss to Sally and his family must be unfathomable and our thoughts and prayers continue to be with them, even as we try to come to terms with the gaping holes left in our lives and community. God be with you Sally.

A FRUITFUL OFFER

As the spring flowers come out, as blossom starts to fall and we look ahead to fruit growing on trees and bushes it is hard to believe that all this life comes

from seeds and bulbs that once looked so unattractive and dead.

The average sized apple tree will produce around 500 apples a year. Looking at a small and shrivelled apple seed it seems that it could never produce a tree let alone a crop of fruit. Yet a tiny seed can produce a bumper crop.

One of the images Jesus uses for his death on the cross is that of a seed. His death on a cross like a seed looks unattractive and weak. A God on the cross seems to be a weak and powerless God.

Yet, like a seed, Jesus gets buried deep into the ground and the claim of Easter is like a seed he burst out of the ground into a life that produces the fruit of forgiveness and a promise of life beyond the grave.

With such a fruitful offer, is it time to take a second look at the Easter story? The Easter celebrations may have ended, but there's still time!

As a special treat, Dane had brought along a bottle of port, and everyone was treated to a shot glass. This was extremely tasty, and left a mellow feeling as you sipped.

Devon Yawl No. 12 - Scilla - the last of the original first batch of twelve boats.

Very substantially re-furbished by the previous owner about 15 years ago and one of the most attractive yawls in the fleet, with a British Racing Green hull and varnished wood trim. Some routine maintenance is needed to bring her back up to top condition again, but structural improvements have been made in recent years, such as adding a bow buoyancy bulkhead, reinforcing the stern deck and improving the side buoyancy tanks, to keep her in top condition.

Two suits of sails, Bramber combination trailer/trolley with spare wheel, 4 hp Mercury outboard with less than 30 hours use, anchor, chain and warp, bailer pump, two rudders, oars and rowlocks, cover (elderly, but intact).

She has been sailed very little in the last five years, but there is good reason to believe that she is still a fairly competitive boat.


Wanted, Scarecrow makers of all ages for our flower festival

I feel that I would need to know the ratio of affordable housing proposed (10%, 50% 80% or whatever) before answering. Affordable Housing can be built under a number of different circumstances, Question 14 gives just one example, but the proposed ratio is always of crucial importance to me, even if the village cannot dictate it
Whilst I appreciate that this questionnaire is still a relatively early step in the Neighbourhood Plan, I propose to add a note after the answer Yes or No saying: 'But see Question 35' where I shall make it clear what I mean by my answer. You may choose to do likewise for this or any other of your answers.

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING 53/18

IT WAS RESOLVED THAT the minutes of the meeting held on 13 March 2018

accepted as a correct record

Resolution carried unanimously. The minutes were signed by the Chairman.

54/18 **MATTERS ARISING**

- 54.1 Web mail: DV would pend any action on linking personal e-mails for the time being.
- 54.2 New Residents' Welcome Pack: Steve Comley tabled a proposal for a new residents' welcome pack. DV would draft a section on the work of the parish council and then DV circulated the pack to other councillors for comment.
- 54.3 Shed to store road salt: JD had been in touch with the National Trust and was awaiting a reply.
- 54.4 Caring for vulnerable residents: JW suggested a letter be sent out with the Ringmore Newsletter in November or December. The letter would give a phone number of a volunteer to oversee people who might need help during adverse weather and co-ordinate volunteers who might be able to offer practical help.
- 54.5 Three Ways Demolition: JW had asked the contractor for a schedule of heavy vehicle JR movements and JR agreed to remind the contractor.






