



## THANKS FOR HARVEST, AUTUMN AND EVERYTHING

Autumn is the time when hundreds of churches throughout the country hold a service of Harvest Thanksgiving, to thank God for his goodness. The tradition of celebrating Harvest Festival, in the way that we know it today, was first introduced in 1843 by Revd. Robert Hawker of Morwenstow, at a time when this country was primarily rural. As most people made a living from their fields, this was an opportunity to give thanks for being able to have the absolute necessities of life, unlike today when we do not have to do without food if bad weather affects the crops, for we can obtain similar produce from abroad. Generally, we are able to buy fruit and vegetables whenever we want, and maybe we take it all for granted, forgetting that what we have, wherever it comes from, is a gift from God, products of his creation.

In the hustle and bustle of our everyday lives, as we spend so much time rushing around and trying to fit in so many things, maybe we barely notice what a wonderful world we live in. However, when we pause to look around us, we will see examples of God's goodness to us and the wonders and beauty, of his creation. For the fruit and vegetables, whether they are fresh from the ground or the tree, or processed in a tin, the plants and flowers in our gardens, are all products of the partnership of humanity with God, or of God with humanity, where human toil and tools, work with nature, and with God.

In nature, the season of autumn brings something different each day, as the colours of leaves change overnight, offering us a fresh invitation to enjoy the beauty that God's creation gives us. However, this is something we need to be aware of, not just in autumn, but every day of the year. Every day holds its own particular blessings and aspects of beauty to be enjoyed and appreciated with a spirit of gratitude. These could be in things like the beautiful smile of a child or grandchild; a meaningful conversation with a good friend; a nice meal with a friend, or partner, or spouse, or a thoughtful gesture by someone we meet during the course of our day. So, although autumn calls us to stop and enjoy the particular beauty of each day as it comes to us, and to thank God for it, it also reminds us that these are God's special ways of showing us that he is with us in every season and every time of our lives.

#### **Kingsbridge Foodbank**





# **OPEN STUDIO INVITATION**

Painter and Printmaker Judith Woodings and Jeweller Caro Barrett are again taking part in the South Hams Arts Trail this month. The Arts Trail is an annual event which features the work of 68 artists in studios across south Devon from 13th – 28th October 2018.

Trees and woodland, bent and formed by weather and reflected in still pools; Devon landscapes bathed in evening light. These are the themes of Judith's work. Her recent images explore the unusual process of Mokulito/wood lithography and allow for prints that combine painterly marks with the qualities of woodcut. She has recently been selected as a Member of the Devon Guild of Craftsmen. Judith will be demonstrating her printmaking process in her studio.

Caro's jewellery is inspired by the coast of South Devon - a bright curved line of sunlight on a wave or the tide-washed furrows and ridges of the beach. Using the challenging technique of fusing gold to silver Caro's new work plays with abstract shapes and simple, clean lines. She is a Fairtrade Foundation-registered jeweller and works in Fairtrade gold, recycled silver and ethically-sourced stones.

During the two-week Trail Judith and Caro will be in the studio to answer questions and explain about their work and methods. The studio will be open from 11 – 5pm daily during the event (closed Mon 22nd Oct).




# A Game of Chess

September has been a very busy month with all the preparations for the South West Outdoor Festival (SWOF) on the 5<sup>th</sup>-7<sup>th</sup> October at East Soar farm. SWOF is organised by the National Trust in partnership with Cotswold Outdoor and supported by the South West Coast Path Association (SWCPA), Ordnance Survey, the South Devon AONB and Devon Wildlife Trust. Its aim is to shine a light on the many adventure pursuits that can be explored along the South Hams coastline welcoming everyone from accomplished outdoor experts through to adventure-curious beginners and active families. There will be a range of pursuits to suit every age group and level of fitness. With lots of hard work and improvements in the Ringmore Orchard we seem to have a good crop and we have already done our first apple picking this season. The community orchard is run and managed by Ringmore community and the apples are picked and used to make juice which is also sold to make funds towards local community activities. Obviously we are happy for any walker going through the orchard to take one apple for some refreshment on their walk but please do not take more as these apples are used by the local community for the benefit of Ringmore parish.

We are now heading into Autumn and the team will be undertaking their annual tree inspections. We ensure to the best of our ability that all the trees along paths, roads and boundaries are safe and healthy and will only do work to trees if they are dead, dying or dangerous. So if you see Ranger Joel (a fully qualified tree inspector) looking up and around the trees on National Trust land you will know that he is completing the tree inspections.

We are still awaiting confirmation on our funding grant to improve Smugglers Lane. We have two thirds of the funding required and should hear soon if we have been successful in our bid for match funding. The stone surfacing and drainage works will improve the quality of the path down to the beach.

## **RINGMORE W.I.**

Ringmore W.I. (and visitors) had their eyes opened at their September meeting, when Roy Beaumont – a Plymouth Street Pastor for ten years – recounted the work the pastors do from 10 pm on Saturday night to 4 am on Sunday morning every week in

Plymouth.

The pastors are voluntary; they pay for their uniforms and training and are on duty one Saturday in four. They are a dedicated group of Christian men and women supported by Plymouth churches whose job is to care, listen and help people who are in need on the streets.

This ranges from helping those who are lost, perhaps because they have drunk too much, to chatting to those who live on the streets, administering first aid and calling an ambulance for someone who has been attacked and is in need of hospital treatment. They have given out thousands of pairs of flip-flops to youngsters who had discarded their shoes in the nightclub, and innumerable bottles of water to rehydrate those who are drunk.

The pastors are backed up by "Prayer Pastors", but avoid mentioning religion unless asked; their emphasis is one showing loving car and concern. At their work is effective; they received a compliment from Devon police that when the Street Pastors are out and about, the level of violence drops by 50%.

So when you are comfortable on a Saturday night in a warm house, and the rain is splashing down outside, give a thought to that dedicated group of ladies and gentlemen called "Plymouth Street Pastors".

Devon Communities Together has now sent their written report on the findings of the Village Questionnaire which was distributed earlier this year. This has been circulated to the Steering Group for discussion before publication.

#### 107/18 DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

BH advised that from now on she would only be able to come to meetings on alternate months due to Modbury PC changing the night of its meetings.

BH also reported that she had given the new advisor to SHDC for the Neighbourhood Plans and the Joint Local Plan a tour of the area to acquaint him with the issues in Bigbury, Challaborough, Kingston and Ringmore etc.

SHDC has said it would like to borrow up to  $\pounds$  60 million on a case by case basis apparently to put into affordable housing, though as yet we don't know how this figure has been calculated. More detailed calculations required and timing considerations with Brexit looming.

#### 108/18 COUNTY COUNCILLOR

RG reported that the new sign for Bullhorn Cross was now in place and explained the reason for the delay and his proposal for dealing with such matters in future.

DCC was actively involved in trying to improve mobile phone reception throughout the county.

RG would circulate material from DCC Trading Standards about the devastating effect of scams defrauding people of their savings.

RG explained why bin bags were no longer carried by the bin lorries and promised to investigate why bags were not available from the Torr Cross depot.

#### 109/18 PARISH PATHS PARTNERSHIP

JR reported that he contractor had now assessed the work to be done in repairing Smugglers Path and costs had risen above the initial estimate. JR was in discussion with the NT about how the work could now be implemented. It was hoped the work would start in November.

It is envisaged that the project to remedy the drainage issue at the edge of Cliffpath's drive will be completed towards the end of October.

#### 110/18 ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS

JD reported the existing paths contractor has agreed to cover the Town Well and Bowling Green due to the retirement of John Reed.

#### 111/18 APPLE ORCHARD

The crop in the community orchard is looking healthy and a number of windfalls had already been collected together with some early maturing fruit. Last year the efforts of volunteers in harvesting and processing fruit generated a substantial contribution towards the night landing site.

Whilst there will not be an apple day this year if there was volunteer help it might be possible to process more of this year's crop and raise more funds, assuming that unauthorized taking of apples could be prevented.

#### 112/18 JOURNEY'S END BOTTLE BANK

There had been no further reports of misuse. BH advised what to do if materials were left outside the container.






