




RAIN AFTER DROUGHT

Could you give some hens a happy home?

Picture this scene: a warm day, the flowers are in bloom, the bees are buzzing around busily and you are sat in your favourite garden seat with a nice cup of tea. What could be better? How about watching some friendly, inquisitive hens scratching around and eating up all those pesky slugs? Even better, how about having some hardworking ex-commercial hens enjoying the freedom their retirement has brought them to watch? If this sounds appealing to you, please consider re-homing some ex-commercial laying hens from the British Hen Welfare Trust. The British Hen Welfare Trust (BHWT) is a national charity which finds pet homes for hens (from mainly caged systems) when they reach the end of their commercial laying careers at 72 weeks of age. These hardworking hens, affectionately known as ex-bats, would otherwise be destined for slaughter, despite having several years of their natural lives left. The BHWT has a network of local teams of volunteers, including Liskeard in Cornwall and South Molton and South Zeal in Devon, who hold re-homing days at the weekend every 6-8 weeks throughout the year. Since 2005, the Devon and Cornwall teams alone have managed to re-home 82,000 hens, saving them from slaughter. Ex-bat hens make fabulous pets and wonderful additions to your family. They will amaze you

with their distinct personalities and their amusing antics. As they have spent so much of their lives confined without access to solid ground and natural sunlight, it is as if they are making up for lost time when they are given new homes; their determination to cram every minute of the day with activity and purpose is astounding. Ex-bat hens will stay out in rain and snow and will push the boundaries of bedtime if they feel there is still fun to be had! These delightful ladies will soon occupy a special place in your heart and you will never want to be without them. Watching a newly re-homed hen flourish and transform from a timid, often tatty, little creature to becoming confident, fully-feathered and full of character is a real life-changing experience and one many rehomers want to be a part of again and again this is one of the main reasons the BHWT has so many second, third (and often many more) time re-homers. Most ex-bat hens will continue to lay delicious free range eggs for you to enjoy and share with your families and friends – a lovely added bonus from your new companions. Hen-keeping is most definitely on the rise; hens are now the UK's sixth most popular pet with many people discovering the benefits of keeping their own hens in their back gardens. Ex-bats, because of their docile and resilient natures, are particularly well-suited to living closely alongside families (and even other pets) and will enjoy your company just as much as you will enjoy theirs. I am pleased to advise the sites are now live and fully operational should there be any need.



Damage- witness appeal.

Between 1100hrs and 1500hrs on Tuesday 7th August damage was caused to a black Peugeot 407 index number WP10 TMU.

This vehicle had been parked unattended in the car park for the Journeys End PH in Ringmore.

Considerable damage has been caused which it is estimated will cost around a £1000 to repair.

It may be totally unconnected but at around 1100hrs there was considerable congestion in the road brought about by way of a lorry carrying a blue container. This Manchester lorry was delivering in the village and clearly had great difficulty negotiating the bends particularly outside of Cross Manor. Indeed the only way the driver could get around was to jump out of his cab and request the

stream of vehicles that had collected behind him reverse. It maybe that one such vehicle perhaps a lorry or van then reversed into the car park causing the damage? The details of the offending vehicle have not been supplied to the unfortunate owner of the Peugeot.

Did you witness this incident? Were you perhaps stuck within the congestion? Better still any dash-cam footage? If you have any knowledge at all please advise.


