#### REMEMBERING TO SAY 'THANK YOU'

'Thank you' is one of the first words that we learn to say as children, and possibly one of the first words we forget to say as Christians. Often our prayers are littered with the word 'please', but sparse on the words 'thank you' as we ask God for this, that, and the next thing. But when he answers our requests, how often do we remember to say 'thank you'?

There is a story about the vicar of a small seacoast town, who at the end of each year, used to write a report in the parish magazine of what had happened during the year. One year his parishioners noticed an unusual entry, for among the facts and figures about the church membership, there was an entry which said, 'nine missing at sea'. They were puzzled about this, because they couldn't remember even one person, let alone nine, being lost at sea, so someone asked the vicar what this meant. He replied that during the year eleven people had asked for prayers for family members who were going to sea to be included in the intercessions. And he said that since only two of these people had later expressed thanks to God for the safe return of their loved ones, he was assuming that the other nine were still missing at sea. He said that few of us would dream of not saying 'thank you' to someone for a kindness they had done, so why should it be any different when it comes to God?

The hymn 'Now thank we all our God', was written during the 30 Years War when its author, Martin Rinkhart, was conducting as many as 40 funerals a day for the victims of the war and the plague. And in spite of his own personal sorrow in losing his wife, he had still been able to give thanks to God for all the wonders of life. Just as Henry Francis Lyte, the author of the hymn 'Abide with Me' had written his hymn 'Praise my Soul the King of Heaven' even although he had been suffering with ill health for much of his life.

There are many different ways of saying 'Thank You' to God, ranging from prayer, to worship and to loving and caring for others – thanking Him for his countless blessings and for listening to us when we pray to Him for ourselves and for others.



#### Dear Editor

John Bracey was a founder member and president of The Building Forum of Devon and Cornwall, a mentor to many of the Committee and much respected in the building industry. When he died the Committee decided to give a seat to remember him by.

After initial siting problems Tracey and Conor kindly agreed to have the seat in the garden of The Journey's End where John spent many happy hours and it was finally unveiled on Tuesday August 13th.

The seat is a brilliant memorial to John's unique character with a design by his son Pete which cleverly incorporates references to the rocks at Ayrmer Cove, a Fibbonacci helix and a sneaky pair of shorts carved in Portland stone, and iroko timber slats with jarrah wood inserts, all reflecting John's love of the area, his interest in good craftsmanship woodwork and detailing, his use of mathematics in designing his house and garden, and his eccentric clohing.

The seat is beautifully crafted by Yogi King and a local sculptress. Thank you to The Building Forum for their gift which I am sure will be well used and a reminder of one of Ringmore's characters.

I didn't know that the seat was to be unveiled until the day before so apologise to anyone who would have liked to be present.

- \*\*Councillor Baker stated that no comment could be made on this as it may compromise the current work of the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group

#### Mrs Ann Bracey

Development on this site is inappropriate as it is visible from the AONB No infrastructure to support the build 3 dwellings opens up the site for further development

**Mr Carson** gave a brief history of his early life in Ringmore and his ties with local families and the plan that the three proposed dwellings were for local people including family members.

**Councillor Reynolds** stated that the houses on the plan had been well positioned to ensure they did not overlook nearby properties. He expressed serious concerns regarding the status of land outlined in blue on the map (0938-BSP)

Mr Carson stated he was not looking to develop this land at the moment

**Councillor Reynolds** also raised concerns regarding some of the statements made in the in the Design and Access Statement, Visual Impact Statement, &Transport Statement his view that some of the statements were 'disingenuous at best and other were totally incorrect such as the statement regarding the safety of the proposed footpath opening on to the main thoroughfare from Cockle lane. He reiterated the Council's concerns regarding the future of the additional land

**Councillor Baker identified** an issue regarding thee access point on to the main thoroughfare and explained in detail how it would not be possible to make this access point safe for road users. He also stated that anew road would need to adhere to the current highway policies and would therefore include street lighting. Councillor Baker also requested information regarding the status of the Mr Carson's various companies.

**Mr Carson** confirmed that the PIP land designated by the red line on the application map 0938-BSP is registered to TEC Group Holdings Ltd.

**Draft Minutes** 

**Mr Carson** stated he would get clarification on the points raised and would himself object to any proposal for street lighting

Councillor Campbell stated that he had compared the 2017 planning refusal document to the current planning proposal. He noted that the current application does not fully address the issues raised in the refusal e.g. Protection of the AOND, the Cirl Bunting Conservation zone, additional light pollution associated with the proposed access road and transport policies indicating the need for street lighting and the intrinsically unsafe nature of the access/ egress point. He also raised concerns that the access statement underestimated the amount and type of traffic using the main thoroughfare and that the additional housing would increase the congestion currently experienced on this road. Also the supporting documentation appears to be full of erroneous statements at best mistakes and at worse disingenuous. This damages the credibility of the proposal.

**Mr Carson** explained that PIP did not require details such as those outlined above and that these would be addressed in the technical details application as the planning proposal moves through the process.

**Councillor Vincent** stated that the design was very positive and welcomed the opportunity to have new families in the community.

**Councillor King** stated that that he was not unhappy with the design or the proposal but was concerned about the potential for them becoming holiday homes. He asked Mr Carson if it was possible to put a Devon Resident clause in so that any ongoing sale would only be possible to buyers who had live in Devon for the past 2 years.

He also reiterated the concern regarding the future of land outlined in blue and whether this should be maintained as a green space in some form or other.

**Councillor Reynolds/Councillor Campbell** proposed a compromise that it would be possible to pass the proposed PIP if certain aspects could be addressed.

The future of the land outlined in blue, consideration for designating it green space/ village amenity/wild area conservation area


Work with the Councillors and the local community regarding some of the design aspects e.g. Ridge height of roof. Continuing protection of Dark Skies access from main thoroughfare into the development

**Councillor Reynolds** also reiterated the need for the design and access and other statements attached to the PIP to be review for accuracy.

#### **Outcome**

**Draft Minutes** 

It was agreed that Ringmore Parish Council would withhold their refusal/objection to the application until Friday 16th August 2019 to allow Mr Carson to consider whether withdrawal of the current PIP would be appropriate at this time in favour of closer working with the Council and the local community to present acceptable solutions to the significant concerns raised.




