County Councillor update (RG):

- Reported that, based on numbers on the electoral role for Ringmore, the population is remaining fairly static. In many rural areas in the South Hams population is falling.
- Reminded Council to report all concerns and faults online: <u>https://www.devon.gov.uk/roadsandtransport/report-a-problem/</u>
- Updated that the Connecting Devon and Somerset fibre to premises broadband project is rolling out and target completion date is 2024. Priority is given to properties with no or very slow broadband currently.
- Requested an email detailing all the info. required regarding a query about the rise in COVID cases and what we can do in Devon to ease this.
- Requested an email regarding parents' concerns about the school transport which he will refer onto the relevant officer
- Noted concern that a recent incident in the parish highlighted the shortage of paramedics in rural areas.
- Confirmed that Tor Quarry is included in the long-term plan to upgrade DCC Waste and Recycling Centres.

RG left at 7.25

District Councillor update (BT):

- SHDC have adopted a 20 year vision to help business thrive and support recovery from COVID
- SHDC are working hard behind the scenes to sort out the problems with the recycling service.
- BT confirmed that SHDC cannot contribute to the extra costs of the skip hire in Ringmore caused by the suspension of the green waste collection but did agree to grant £300 of his locality budget towards it.

2021 97 Apologies for absence due to work commitments were accepted from Clir Campbell.

- 2021 98 DV declared an interest in agenda item 2021 102 (3), being finance secretary for the church council.
- 2021 99 It was resolved that the minutes of the meeting held on Thursday 9th Sept 2021 be accepted as a correct record. The minutes were signed by the Chair.

Item 2021 107 (2) was brought forward and standing orders dropped to receive an update about the rewilding project from the volunteers:

- First phase seeds and bulbs have been purchased
- Thanks to AK who has removed the turf and cut the grass.
- Planting will begin as soon as weather permits
- A temporary sign will be erected
- It will take approx. 3 years for the verge to come to full fruition.
- RB thanked the volunteers for all their work

2021 100 Training

- a) It was agreed that AK would organise the defibrillator training and liaise with MS re promotion in the newsletter. Training to take place in January
- b) It was agreed that the clerk and MS would participate in the website virtual training offered by VisionICT and Council would consider changes to the clerk's hours as a result of adding website to the JD at the next meeting.
- c) No Councillor was able to attend the DALC Councillor training event in November

2021 103 Challaborough

- a) DV and MS fed back on their meeting with the Manager of Park Dean regarding concerns about unauthorised and unsightly developments on the sea-front. The siting of the large container remains a challenge and **DV and MS to pursue.**
- b) The waste land at the bottom of Challaborough (where the bottle banks are) was discussed and agreed that MW will request that Parkdean arrange for the containers to be emptied.

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2021 104 Broadband

Council decided there was no action to take in response to the communication from West Devon detailing a faster broadband deal.

2021 105 Queen's Platinum Jubilee

It was agreed that Council would encourage and support groups and individuals in the parish to organise an event, that BT would ask if there was any funding available and that this would be an on-going agenda item.

2021 106 The Neighbourhood Plan update was received:

The Ringmore Neighbourhood Plan is still under Regulation 17 which is the review carried out by a Government Planning Inspector to ensure that the basic conditions of a Neighbourhood Plan are met by the proposal. The inspector requested a report from the Steering Group justifying the inclusion of a Principle Property policy RNP 4 for new builds in the parish. This has been submitted and is based on the Appeal hearing for St Ives and several other Neighbourhood Plans. We are still waiting for the inspector's response.

2021 107 Environmental matters:

- It was agreed that Ringmore would benefit from having a dedicated Lengthsman and all councillors will contribute to a specification in preparation for submitting a grant application to DCC Highways Management Community Enhancement Fund.
- 2. The rewilding update was received earlier
- 3. Ringmore Community Orchard Roger and Robbie Bristow will be taking responsibility for the management of The Orchard and JR will do the handover.

2021 108 Parish Paths Partnership update:

The dredging of the stream on the path below Lower Manor Farm is planned and it is hoped this will prevent the annual flooding problems.

2021 109 Representation on the Four Rivers Dementia Alliance:

It was resolved that MS would put a request for expressions of interest from parishioners in the next Newsletter
